Mid-march brought blue skies and mild temperatures; perfect for SLA, along with clients and friends, to hike fern canyon one of the many trails in Red Rock Canyon. This was the first hike we have done as a group and it was a great opportunity to reconnect with nature and test our knowledge of the native plant species. The hike starts on a plateau of grasses and yucca. Working your way into the canyon the vegetation changes to black brush and Ponderosa pines. A narrow path leads you into the canyon with the first sprouts of wildflowers starting to bloom out of the crusty red clay. Scrambling over

FAVORITE FLORA: BERLANDIERA LYRATA - CHOCOLATE FLOWER - BY: MATT DURHAM



What is better than enjoying a landscape in bloom? Enjoying a landscape in bloom that smells like chocolate of course! Engaging all the senses is an important aspect when designing a landscape and a well thought out plant palette can really add to the experience. Whether it's the rustling leaves of a Fremont Poplar (Poplar fremontii) or the soft touch to the Lambs Ear (Stachys byzantina), there are many plants that work well in connecting a person to a landscape. One of my personal favorites is the Chocolate Flower (Berlandiera lyrata).

Native to areas of Texas and southeastern Arizona, perennial enjoys full sun locations in the Las Vegas Valley. The Chocolate Flower grows to about

1.5 to 3 ft. tall and wide and blooms in the spring, summer and some years into the fall. After the yellow flowers form seed heads, the seeds can be collected and distributed back into the landscape for added blooms and more fragrance next year. This plant is great to use around a doorway, window or patio area where its best qualities can be enjoyed.
