
There is a lot of garbage out there, but you don't need to collect it.

## Favorite Flora: Agave victoriae-reginae - By DK Roth



We are immersed in a world full of patterns. If you pay close attention to your surroundings, you will notice repeating forms and regularities in our environment – from the hexagons on the honeycomb you purchased at your local farmer's market, to the cobwebs building in the corners of your bookshelf, and to the mirrored wings of a butterfly. Us humans are naturally drawn to things that are symmetrical, and we generally perceive them as aesthetically harmonious and balanced.

The Agave victoriae-reginae, or more commonly known as Queen Victoria Agave is a great example of rosette

symmetry. This attractive, clump-forming agave has tapered deep green leaves lined with white margins. With its manageable size (grows only up to 18"x18"), the Queen Victoria Agave is excellent for cactus gardens or in pots. Its striking geometric features make for a great specimen. Make sure to plant it in full sun, and water well during summer and spring, while allowing the soil to dry completely in between.

Fun facts: The Queen Victoria Agave was discovered by the Spaniards in the 17th century. They utilized them for fibers to create clothing and ropes and turned its extracts into "honey-water" or pilque. Although it is now widely grown and used as an ornamental plant, it can also be used for making the distilled liquor 'mezcal'.
